

ANOOP MISHRA, IAS (1978 UP Cadre)

1. Chief Secretary, Government of Uttar Pradesh: One year

Overall responsibility of the State Administration, superintendence of law and order, and the developmental and infrastructure schemes in the State. Conduct of General Elections 2012 in Uttar Pradesh.

2. Chairman , UP State Road Transport Corporation: Two years

Responsible for the operations and management of the UP Road Transport Corporation.

3. Chairman, Board of Revenue, Uttar Pradesh: Seven months

Responsible for the overall superintendence and control of the Revenue administration of the State.

4. Cabinet Secretariat , Joint Secretary: Two years

Worked as Joint Secretary in the Cabinet Secretariat; was assigned responsibilities for the strategic Ministries such as Home, Defence, External Affairs, Atomic Energy and Space and the economic Ministries such as Finance and Commerce, Planning Commission, etc.

5. Economic Affairs – Government of India: Nine-and-a-half years

Joint Secretary, Dept. of Economic Affairs: One year

Responsible for the resolution and settlement of the Dabhol Power Project issue (Enron project) and for the financial restructuring and restart of the Project as Ratnagiri Gas and Power Private Ltd.

Minister (Economic), Embassy of India, Washington DC, USA: Three years

Responsible for the bilateral Indo-US Economic relations and coordination with IMF and the World Bank. The Indo-US Finance and Economic Forum, the Indo-US CEOs Forum, etc., were started and served at that time. '*Economic News*', a fortnightly publication in US, covering all economic news from India was started. A Business Portal "*Doing Business in India*" to facilitate US Investments in India was launched during this period.

Joint Secretary, Institutional Finance (Banking): Two-and-a-half years

Associated with restructuring and corporatization of IDBI and IFCI; restructuring of the State Finance Corporations; amendments to the National Housing Board Act which was a precursor to the SRFESI Act. Also associated with amendments to the SIDBI Act, the

EXIM Bank Act and SFC Act. Responsible for the amendments to the DRT Act, and the establishment and functioning of DRTs and DRATs in the country.

Director, Foreign Investments - Government of India - Three Years

Responsible for foreign equity and quasi equity matters. Associated with the formulation of the GDR/ADR policies, notably the Dollar Denominated ESOPs, fungibility of GDR/ADRs, etc. Responsible for all foreign inflows, including FDI, FII and NRI investments. As Chief Negotiator of Govt. of India, negotiated Bilateral Investment Promotion (BIPA) Agreements with 24 countries. Responsible for Foreign Investment Promotion Board matters in Department of Economic Affairs. Also handled the ECB and other debt related matters in the Government for a brief period.

6. Finance –Government of Uttar Pradesh: Seven years

Three years as Principal Secretary, Finance, Government of Uttar Pradesh. Responsible for formulation of the Budget for the State, finalization of the Annual Plan for the State, resource mobilization and tax collection.

As Special Secretary and Secretary Finance, Government of Uttar Pradesh, for five years, was responsible for expenditure control, Budget formulation, resource mobilization, etc.

7. Industries: Nine years

Infrastructure and Industrial Dev. Commissioner, Uttar Pradesh: Two years

Responsible for all infrastructure projects in the State of UP on Public Private Partnership (PPP) basis. The notable PPP Projects include Yamuna Expressway connecting Delhi to Agra; case two Thermal Power Projects, aggregating a total capacity of 6,000 MW at Meja, Bara and Karchana, of which the first two are under construction; two transmission projects aggregating Rs.10,000 crore, one for East Uttar Pradesh and the second for West Uttar Pradesh; State Highways on Viability Gap Funding Model; Medical Colleges on PPP basis; ITIs and Polytechnics on PPP Basis. Piloted establishment of Greenfield International Airports at Kushi Nagar and the Taj International Airport at Jewar.

Secretary, Industrial Development, Uttar Pradesh: Three years

Responsible for promotion and facilitation of industries in UP. Also responsible for the Industrial Policy of the State, the SEZ Act for UP, Private Universities Act for UP, etc.

Deputy Secretary, Petroleum & NG, Govt. of India: Four years

Responsible for the fourth round of bidding for production sharing exploration contracts, and the natural gas sector.

8. District Magistrate, Uttar Pradesh: Two years

Field administration, local governance, responsibility of Law and Order, and development administration.
